PRAYERS

From one who is ill or isolated

MORNING PRAYER IN LENT

Each day those who are Priests and Ministers in the Church of England will say our prayers. You can be assured that we are praying for you whether you are at home either because you need to stay away, or because you are ill.

It is helpful to know that the same prayers are being used across the whole nation. We invite you to join with us using this liturgy throughout Lent.

Preparation

O Lord, open our lips

All and our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Hear our voice, O Lord, according to your faithful love,

All according to your judgement give us life.

Blessed are you, God of compassion and mercy, to you be praise and glory for ever.

In the darkness of our sin, your light breaks forth like the

dawn and your healing springs up for deliverance.

As we rejoice in the gift of your saving help,

sustain us with your bountiful Spirit and open our lips to sing your praise.

Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

All Blessed be God for ever.

A Song of Penitence

- Have mercy on me, O God, in your great goodness; according to the abundance of your compassion blot out my offences.
- 2 Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3 For I acknowledge my faults and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight,
- 5 So that you are justified in your sentence and righteous in your judgement.
- 6 Cast me not away from your presence and take not your holy spirit from me.
- 7 Give me again the joy of your salvation and sustain me with your gracious spirit;
- 8 Then shall I teach your ways to the wicked and sinners shall return to you.

The second reading for the day is read, or the following. Matthew 6 25-33

²⁵ "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? 27 And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? 28 And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. 30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? 31 Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' 32 For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. 33 But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.




Some heart-burning verses from the Bible from Session 1
